

What's in my Fertilizer?

What do the numbers mean?

All plant food products, including lawn foods, are labeled with three numbers separated by dashes. The numbers represent the percentage by weight of the three most important plant nutrients.

For example:
10 – 20 – 10

First Number: (N) Nitrogen

- Promotes green leaves
- **ABOVE-GROUND** growth

Second Number: (P) Phosphorus

- Promotes roots
- **BELOW-GROUND** growth
- **FRUIT AND FLOWER** development

Third Number: (K) Potassium

- Promotes disease & drought tolerance and all around health of plant.

How to remember what each of the three nutrients does:

(N) UP (P) DOWN (K) ALL AROUND



For Garden: 10 – 20 – 10 Plant 10 days after application.



For Garden & Lawn: 13 – 13 – 13



For Lawn: 21 – 5 – 8 31 – 0 – 0 41 – 0 – 0

(FE) = IRON

Provides deep greening to the lawn without making it grow, like Nitrogen. Iron DOES NOT promote top growth—only Nitrogen does.
